ABCD creates resilient & thriving communities by teaching local people and organizations how to identify, nurture and mobilize existing community assets and talents for change.

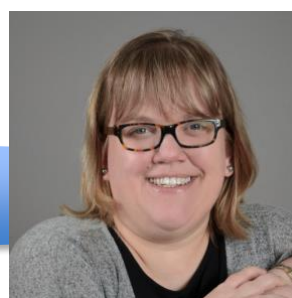
